It is a non-governmental, independent, and non-profit organization that operates based on a humanitarian approach grounded in a strategic plan aimed at promoting and entrenching the principles of human rights and building a developed civil society, in alignment with the global vision for sustainable development. The organization was established in 1992 by a group of volunteers and holds consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).

Our organization is an independent, non-governmental, non-profit entity that serves the public interest. It is responsive, adaptable, and open to both national and global perspectives. We operate in accordance with the humanitarian values we have adopted, aiming to contribute to improving the quality of life, promoting human rights and democracy, and building an effective and progressive civil society. We support human development and protect individual choices through peacebuilding and the promotion of peaceful coexistence. We also work to strengthen the capacities of individuals and communities, encourage participation in decision-making, and promote resilience to prevent potential risks.



The number of funded projects reached 28, including 11 self-funded projects, benefiting a total of 48,434 individuals.


Adopting a comprehensive strategy to combat drug abuse in parallel with strengthening community security.
